### THE LIST OF HIGHER EDUCATION PROVIDERS AND THE RESPECTIVE LAW DEGREES IN THE UNITED KINGDOM, AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND RECOGNISED BY THE BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE CERTIFICATE IN LEGAL PRACTICE EXAMINATION

1. Please be informed that the Board has carried out a review of the **existing** list of Higher Education Providers (HEPs) and the respective law degrees in the United Kingdom, Australia and New Zealand recognised by the Board for the purpose of the Certificate in Legal Practice (CLP) Examination. During the review process, the Board has also received **new applications** for recognition of law degrees from HEPs in the United Kingdom and Australia for the purpose of the CLP Examination.
2. The review is part of the Board's periodic measures to ensure that the recognised law degrees align with the standards and requirements of the legal profession in Malaysia. The Board is committed to maintaining the highest standards in legal education and admission qualifications to the legal profession in accordance with its functions under section 5 of the Legal Profession Act 1976 [Act 166].
3. During the meeting held on **5 January 2026**, the Board had deliberated on the findings of the review. After due deliberation, the Board hereby declares that—
  - (a) the existing HEPs and the respective law degrees recognised by the Board as listed in **APPENDIX A** shall continue to be recognised for the purpose of the CLP Examination; and
  - (b) the new HEPs and the respective law degrees as listed in **APPENDIX B** shall be recognised for the purpose of the CLP Examination with effect from **1 January 2026**.
4. The candidates who have successfully completed all academic requirements **on or after 1 January 2026** leading to the recognised law degree at the new HEPs referred to in **APPENDIX B** are eligible to apply for registration to sit for the CLP Examination, subject to other requirements that have to be fulfilled for the purpose of registration. Completion of all academic requirements leading to the recognised law degree shall be evidenced by an official transcript and/or official award notification stating that the date of final results or award falls **on or after 1 January 2026**.

5. The recognition granted by the Board to the HEPs and the respective law degrees as listed in **APPENDIX A** and **APPENDIX B** is subject to future review in accordance with the policies and decisions of the Board.
6. After due deliberation, the Board also hereby declares that the recognition granted to the following HEPs and the respective law degrees **be withdrawn** with effect from the dates as stated below:
