

A STATEMENT ON SIX CORE SUBJECTS

On 18 March 1995 and April 1998, the Legal Profession Qualifying Board, Malaysia issued the New Guidelines on qualifications and requirements to qualify to sit for the Certificate in Legal Practice (CLP) Examination.

According to the New Guidelines, candidates must pass the following six core subjects, out of a minimum of twelve law subjects and each of the core subjects shall be studied for the duration of one academic year. They are:

- i) Law of Contract
- ii) Law of Torts
- iii) Constitutional Law
- iv) Criminal Law
- v) Land Law
- vi) Equity & Trusts

The Board at its meeting on 12 July 2002 and again at its meeting on 17 June 2005 has decided that a person who was conferred the LL.B degree without passing any of the core subjects will not be allowed to sit for CLP even though after the conferment of the LL.B degree he/she subsequently sat and passed any of the core subjects.
